NDOT Implements New Stormwater Inspection Software for 2025 Facility Runoff Control Plan (FRCP) Inspections

Nebraska DOT is utilizing new software called SWPPPTrack to inspect, report and manage stormwater compliance and other environmental commitments on construction projects and maintenance facilities across the state. This new software is replacing the ECODatabase Inspection System.



SWPPPTrack leverages new technology, to provide comprehensive solutions for managing stormwater runoff, safeguarding the environment, and meeting regulatory requirements. Highlights include:

- 1. **Mobile-Ready Solutions**: SWPPPTrack offers a user-friendly mobile app that streamlines compliance tasks. Field personnel can easily record inspections, track best management practice (BMP) maintenance, and report findings—all from their smartphones or tablets.
- Real-Time Data: SWPPPTrack enables real-time data collection. Inspectors can capture photos, document observations, and sync information instantly. This enhances transparency and facilitates timely corrective actions.
- 3. **Efficiency and Accuracy**: SWPPPTrack reduces paperwork, minimize errors, and enhances efficiency.

NDEE Postcard Reminder – Annual TIER II Reporting

NDOT is required to submit Emergency and Hazardous Chemical Inventory Forms annually per federal regulation Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) Title III: **Emergency Planning and Community Right-to- Know Act (EPCRA**). Businesses are required to report the locations and quantities of chemicals stored on-site to state and local governments to help communities prepare to respond to chemical spills and similar emergencies. This reporting is required annually **from January 1 to March 1** and can be completed online by following this Online <u>NDEE Tier II System link</u> and selecting "Enter Tier II Form Submission System.

Postcard from NDEE

NDEE sends a reminder postcard (with facility identification numbers and passwords) to facilities subject to those regulations every January. The annual postcard from NDEE includes the necessary information to complete the online reporting. New Posters

NDOT provides spill prevention education through Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), posters, trainings, and engagement. Below are updated posters that you will find at your facility. If you have not received updated posters, please reach out to Shane Sisel (shane.sisel@nebraska.gov).

Good Housekeeping & Pollution Prevention Poster

The new NDOT Good Housekeeping and Pollution Prevention poster highlights Best Management Practices that can be implemented at your facility. Sensitive areas such as vehicle and equipment areas, bulk storage containers, product and materials storage, and waste materials all have specific BMPs that, when implemented, can minimize potential pollutant runoff.

Winter Weather Poster

NDOT Winter Weather Operations poster covers facility housekeeping, salt and brine storage and application, and how to manage yard snow melt. BMP recommendations such as washing trucks and equipment in designated areas, storing salts downslope, and plowing snow away from drainage ways can be found on the poster.



SPCC Poster

Any facility that meets the threshold of have aboveground bulk oil storage capacity **greater than** 1,320-gallons or underground storage tanks **greater than** 42,000-gallons is required to have a Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure Plan, or SPCC. This poster identifies BMPs to mitigate spills and how to act fast in a situation. Check with your facility supervisor if your facility has a SPCC plan and know where it is maintained.
