

Cook's Corner

Pork Sausage Casserole

1 lb seasoned ground pork

1 can cream of mushroom soup ½ cup chopped onion

3/4 cup milk

½ tsp pepper

3 cups raw potatoes, sliced

1 can sliced mushrooms



Brown pork sausage and drain. Mix soup, milk, onion, and pepper together in a bowl. Layer half of the potatoes in a greased 9x9 baking dish, pour half of the soup mixture over it, then repeat. Bake at 350° F for 1 hour and 15 mins
